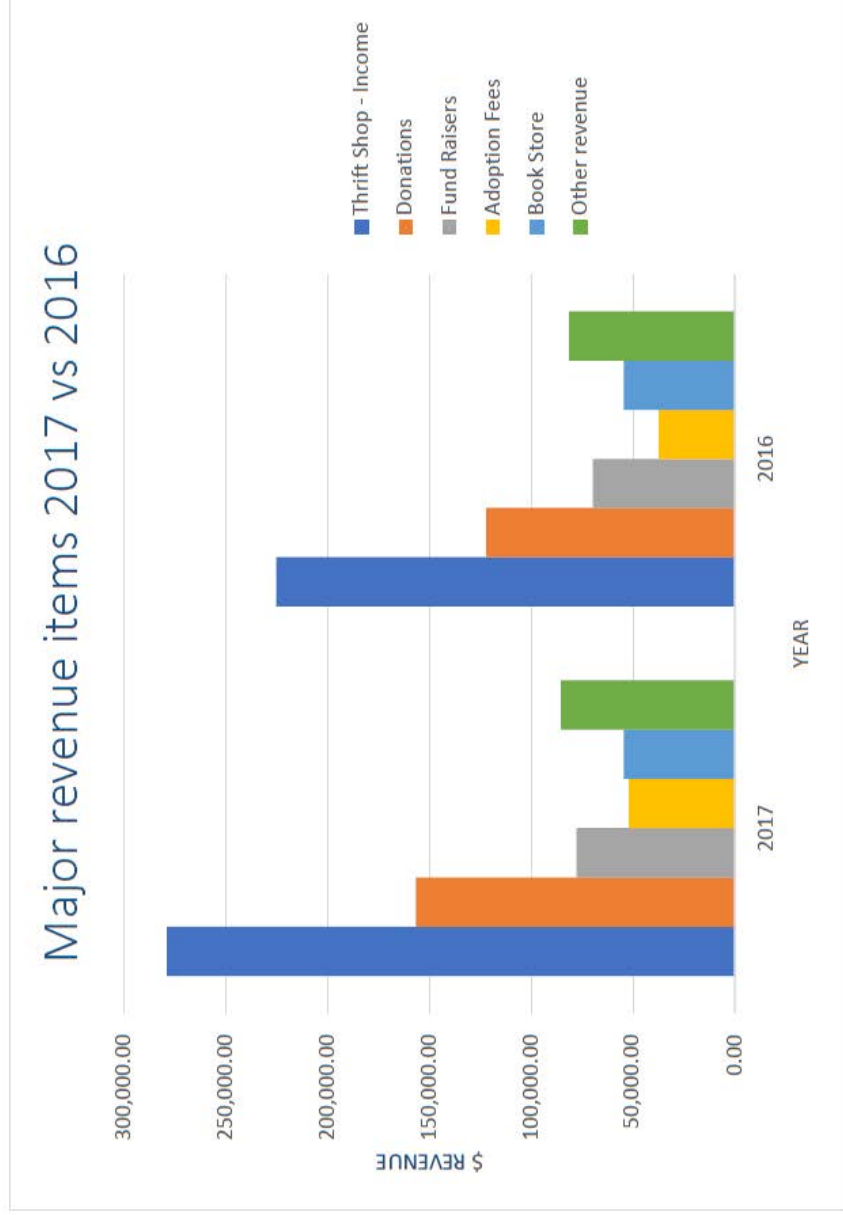

2017 Financial Review (all amounts shown are unaudited and in KYD)

Whilst 2017 saw large increases in Thrift Shop income (an increase of \$53.8K) and Donations (an increase of \$34.5K), these increases were completely wiped out by the significant increase in the cost of veterinary services (an increase of \$88.7k)
